Future Projects Task Force Joint Programmes:

- 1) **Investigation on future workshops on „The Management of Joint Programmes“ in varying geographic context**, e.g. Europe, Latin America, Australia
 - pre-requisite: need analysis in the target region by a UN New Initiative for that purpose
 - activities depending on the availability of grants within Erasmus+

2) Investigation on successful formats of collaboration of Joint Programmes (JP) and industries/enterprises

Step 1: collect a representative UN sample of JP and define the investigation object

Step 2: mirror the results with the perspective of collaborating employers and what international competences they expect and receive from graduates of the sample JP

3) Preparation of a future Erasmus+ project application within 'Strategic Partnerships'

- continuation of the „JOI“ competence regarding the management of Joint Programmes
- Create a knowledge base:
 - i) *Target*: Joint Programmes, EM selected projects and LLP knowledge alliances
 - ii) *Objective*
 - . how can enterprises be involved in order to create internationally capable graduates
 - . how have industries been consulted when a JP had been developed
 - . managerial side – what tools have been used (templates, formats of collaboration)
 - . if attractive for universities – how to make it attractive for industries
 - iii) *expected collaboration activities (university + industry)*
 - . boards, thesis examiner, curriculum development, implementation phase, initial consultation for learning outcomes, needs analysis
 - iv) *tools and outcomes*
 - guide of best practice
 - stakeholder consultation – is it relevant
